

THE LAKE COMO BEACH WOMEN'S CLUB
HISTORY

The Lake Como Beach Women's Club was organized in the fall of 1927 by President Lawrence W. Mammen, as the social committee of The Lake Como Beach Property Owners Association. Officers were appointed by Mr. Mammen and by-laws were drawn up, which were approved by the Board of Directors and also by The Women's Club.

PURPOSE

Its purpose is to provide entertainment, promote social gatherings, get the members acquainted with each other, and work for the welfare of our community at Lake Como Beach.

BY-LAWS OF THE LAKE COMO BEACH WOMEN'S CLUB
AS AMENDED AND APPROVED NOVEMBER 18, 1930

Section 1.

The name of the club shall be The Lake Como Beach Women's Club.

Section 2.

The object of the club shall be to hold social gatherings at Lake Como Beach in the summer and in Chicago in the winter, to get better acquainted and to promote the interests of The Lake Como Beach Property Owners Association.

Section 3.

Any lady belonging to The Lake Como Beach Property Owners Association or in the immediate family of a member of The Lake Como Beach Property Owners Association and above the age of eighteen years is eligible to become an active member of the club. Friends of members are eligible to social membership only. Social members may share in the social activities but have no voice in the management of the club. Immediate family consists of wife, mother, daughter or sister.

Section 4.

The dues of active members shall be one dollar and of social members fifty cents per year.

Section 5.

The officers of the club shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer.

Section 6.

The president shall preside at all meetings, call special meetings when required, appoint all committees, and have a general supervision of the affairs of the club at all times.

Section 7.

The vice-president shall preside at all meetings in the absence of the president.

Section 8.

The treasurer shall preside in the absence of the vice-president.

Section 9.

The secretary shall keep a correct and regular account of the
